Performers will need to provide their own music, accompanist, or props for the act. Please make sure that all music is in good taste and that all props conform to the Code of Conduct. 
Spirit Contest

All states are encouraged to participate in the spirit contest. Based upon the number of delegates attending the convention, each state will be placed in one of the following categories: small, medium, large, or extra large. Spirit will be judged fifteen minutes before General Assemblies II, III, and IV. The Spirit Contest on Friday will take place during the Roman Procession. Roll call will be included in Tuesday's spirit contest. Roll call, in the form of a state delegation report, will be limited to forty-five seconds and two participants on stage per state. Remember that delegates participating in roll call CANNOT wear shorts, short skirts, tank tops, etc. while on stage. If time limits are exceeded for roll call, a reduction in state points will result. Any type of misconduct or tasteless spirit displays will result in immediate disqualification. Such displays include: discrediting another state or the JCL, noise makers (except during roll call), and distasteful attire. Please note: face paint and body paint will not be allowed on any day. During the final General Assembly, overall spirit awards from each category will be presented to the states that have accumulated the most points throughout the week. Roll call awards will also be given during the final General Assembly.

There will be a spirit orientation meeting on Monday, July 23, 2019 after the first general assembly. Rules and regulations for daily spirit competitions and roll call will be discussed. All questions can be answered at this meeting as well.

N. B. Two delegates from each state must attend or points will be deducted from state points (unless there is only one delegate attending from the state).
