

Nominations Committee/Constitutional Amendment Committee/ & Candidates' Open Forum

In order to vote in the NJCL election, each state/province is required to send two voting delegates to the Nominations Committee Meeting and the Constitutional Amendment Committee Meeting. Also, each state/providence must have at least ten percent of their JCL delegates present at the Candidates' Open Forum in order to receive two votes. To receive two votes at least two delegates must attend, even if one delegate would meet the requirement of 10%. If only one delegate from a state/province is present at the convention, that delegate must attend all three meetings to receive one vote. It is also recommended a State/Provincial Chairperson or a designated representative be present at all three meetings. Ballots for the elections will be distributed at the Candidates' Open Forum.

State/Provincial Chairpersons should designate two voting delegates to attend the Constitutional Amendment Committee Meeting, and the Candidates' Open Forum. Unlike as in the past, the same two delegates are not required to be present at more than one of the meetings. However, the two designated voting delegates will need to register with the Parliamentarian before the start of the Nominating Committee Meeting and the Constitutional Amendment Meeting.

It is suggested one of the delegates to the Constitutional Amendments Committee Meeting should be the state's/province's Parliamentarian. The delegates to the Constitutional Amendment Committee Meeting are required to discuss the proposals with their state/province at fellowship that evening.

If only one delegate attends any of the three meetings, (Nominating Committee Meeting, Constitutional Amendment Committee Meeting, or Candidates' Open Forum) that state/province shall receive only one vote regardless of whether two delegates attend the other meetings. If no delegate attends any of the three meetings, the state/province shall receive no vote. If less than 10% of a state or province's JCL delegates attend the Candidates' Open Forum, that state or province shall have no vote.
